Getting wisdom is vital! Chapters 1-9 explains why:

Man is Simple 9:16-17 - we lack experience in youth so learn from the experience of others!

Man in Sinful 4:23, 6:14,18 - we are naturally included toward evil and must learn the right way - 3:5-7 Proverbs 4:5 Get wisdom, get understanding: forget it not; neither decline from the words of my mouth. 6 Forsake her not, and she shall preserve thee: love her, and she shall keep thee. 7 Wisdom is the principal thing: therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding. 8 Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her.

Principal - SH7225 Also used to describe the first of the first fruits, Ex 23:19, Lev 2:12

From this, all other good things arise.

Without this, no other good things will come!

The point is one of importance - wisdom is the principal thing



First step is listening to words of wisdom

Second step is application

Third step is repeating steps 1 &, 2, even when it's hard - PERSISTENCE!

It takes ACTION, EFFORT and PERSISTENCE to obtain wisdom

Wisdom doesn't come naturally with age, experience, intellect or wealth



MYTH ABOUT WISDOM: "WITH AGE COMES WISDOM"

Solomon built the temple, Hezekiah restored the temple



Hezekiah mirrored his temple dedication to Solomon's,

with sacrifices, a gathering, singing, teaching and the feast of booths (Compare 1 Kings 8 with 2 Chronicles 29:3-34)



Hezekiah's Levites **echoed Solomon's prayers** as they referred to the Temple as "thy dwelling place"

(Compare 2 Chronicles 30:27 with 2 Chron 6:21, 30,33, 39)




And even though it was a weak shadow, Hezekiah did usher in a relative period of porosity, where the nation was delivered from their enemies, a reminder of the glory of Solomon

Sennacherib's Boast (see also Psalm 75:4)



Hezekiah's Sickness

Isaiah 38:1 In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came unto him, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live.

Messengers from Babylon
