  - · His Command: Accompany him on the walk
  - Realize: We have to walk the same path

Simon Peter asked him, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus replied, "Where I am going, you cannot follow now, but you will follow later." Jn 13:35-36



The LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?" Gen 3:9

The LORD God is not searching for Adam

"Where are you?" =>
"You are not with Me"

AT-ONE-MENT

Recognition of Divorce by the act of Sin / Death



#### **The Nature of Atonement**

"I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you." Jn 17:20-21

Becoming one with the Father = Perfect Atonement

=> So we must know what it is we are trying to become!

"Now this is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." Jn 17:3

## Scientifically impossible statement

Thus: not a Father who is His own Son, but a Father who can unite with His sons who were different entities, even once ungodly

=> Trinity eliminates the assurance of atonement

# **Prayer and Intercession**

Jesus went out <u>as usual</u> to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. Lk 22:39

Early in the morning [Job] would sacrifice a burnt offering for each of [his children], thinking, "Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." This was Job's regular custom. Job 1:5



A man <u>regularly</u> dedicated to prayer and communion

A man God can use in the salvation of others

Am I that man?

# **Prayer**

Key to praying for others is humility - but how to get there?

Are my personal prayers asking for gifts or development?



"There was a man who had two sons. The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me...'"

When he came to his senses, he said... 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me...' "Lk 15:11-17

## **Road to Atonement**



"I pray for them. I am not praying for the world, but for those you have given me, for they are yours." Jn 17:9

"My servant Job will pray for you, and I will accept his prayer and not deal with you according to your folly"... So [they] did what the LORD told them; and the LORD accepted Job's prayer. After Job had prayed for his friends, the LORD made him prosperous again Job 42:8-10

My Road to Atonement focuses on the atonement of others
Are others principal in my prayer life?

# **Swordplay in the Garden**

#### Peter strikes!

When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said, "Lord, should we strike with our swords?" And one of them struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. But Jesus answered, "No more of this!" And he touched the man's ear and healed him. Lk 22:49-51

Peter could be forgiven for confusion here - had not his Lord <u>requested</u> swords?

[Jesus] said to them, "But now if you have a purse, take it, and also a bag; and if you don't have a sword, sell your cloak and buy one... The disciples said, "See, Lord, here are two swords." "That is enough," he replied. Lk 22:36-38

So what "swordplay" was Jesus looking for?

#### **Isaiah's Warrior**

The LORD looked and was displeased that there was no justice. He saw that there was no one, he was appalled that there was no one to intervene, so his own arm worked salvation for him, and his own righteousness sustained him. He put on righteousness as his breastplate, and the helmet of salvation on his head; he put on the garments of vengeance and wrapped himself in zeal as in a cloak. Isa 59:15-17

"[Jesus] rose from supper and laid aside his garments"

Jn 13:4

# The Spirit Word of God: The Divider

the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Eph 6:17-18



For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double--edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Heb 4:12

# Correcting Peter's Swordplay

And one of them struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. But Jesus answered, "No more of this!" And he touched the man's ear and healed him. Lk 22:50-51



How do we use the Sword of the Spirit?

# **Our Swordplay**

Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Eph 6:17

Dear friends, although I was very eager to write to you about the salvation we share, I felt I had to write and urge you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to the saints. Jude 3-4

Suggestive of an internal and personal effort 
It does not consist of being contentious

# **Grasping Equality with God**

#### Garden of Gethsemane

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. Phil 2:5-7



#### Garden of Eden

"You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." Gen 3:4-5



Killing the Killer: submission to God working in you



He passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished..." Ex 34:6-7

The Nature of God is a character - not a material type

# The Very Nature of God

Your attitude should be the same as... Jesus: who, being in very nature God, [took] the very nature of a servant...

- · "Nature" = attitude & consequent behaviour, not biology
- Argument is NOT contrasting God's nature with the servant => it's explaining God has always been a Servant!

[God] is not <u>served</u> by human hands, as if he needed anything, because he himself gives all men life and breath and everything else. Acts 17:25

· We are commended to the attitude of a servant because it is the attitude of God

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image" Gen 1:26

## **The Servant Ruler**

"The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors. But you are not to be like that. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves." Lk 22:25-36

Not because those who serve will rule later but because serving is the true way to rule

A woman should learn in quietness and full submission. I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man; she must be silent... But women will be saved through childbearing 1 Tim 2:11-15



## Son of Man: Broken-Hearted

Suggestion is that Jesus' heart ruptured in Gethsemane Evidence:

1 And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground Lk 22:44

Chromidrosis (sweating blood) can follow from heart rupture, from severe emotional trauma

C. A. Helgason, P. A. Wolf, American Heart Association scientific statement, 1997

## 2 Couldn't carry cross

3 ...one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. Jn 19:33-34 - Corpses don't usually bleed. (Unless heart had leaked)



## Son of Man: Broken-Hearted

4 Prophetic Psalm predicts broken heart; no comforters "You know how I am scorned, disgraced and shamed; all my enemies are before you. Scorn has broken my heart and has left me helpless; I looked for sympathy, but there was none, for comforters, but I found none." Ps 69:19-20

# 5 Prophecy of "no comforters" was literal

Then [Jesus] returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Could you men not keep watch with me for one hour?" Matt 26:40

6 "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death" Mk 14:34 - not dramatic posturing




## **Consequences of Heartbreak in the Garden**


#### The Garden was the fatal blow

- Jesus died on the cross, but the fatal blow was struck in Gethsemane: the scorn Ps 69 and the sorrow Mk 14
- He died <u>from</u> our sins not in committing them but in fully <u>realizing</u> the divorce it brought from life, God. (c.f. Gen 6 - the pain that filled God's heart)
- · God's Law doesn't kill. Sin kills
- · Kill the Killer. Or die

# **Betrayal**

But Satan had taken possession of Judah... who was of the number of the twelve Lk 22:3, Lamsa

## Betrayal by whom?



Not just one man!

Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people... With one voice they [Judah] cried out, "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!" ...they [Judah] kept shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" ...with loud shouts they [Judah] insistently demanded that he be crucified, and their [Judah's] shouts prevailed. Lk 23:13-23


He came to that which was his own [Judah], but his own did not receive him. Jn 1:11

# The Obscurity of Treachery

"I tell you the truth, one of you will betray me." They were very sad and began to say to him one after the other, "Surely not I, Lord?" Mt 26:21-22

No-one knew Judas was the traitor


- treachery can be invisible

Peter's remorse is energizing

Peter becomes a pillar of the early church Gal 2:9

I betray Jesus... I feel remorse... what now?

# **Our Trial**

Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Jam 1:2-3



Seems highly inappropriate... offensive?

Suggestion:

An element of Biblical "joy" ≈ "task from God"

Related to "happiness" only in the completion/at the end

# Joy as a "Task" - Evidence

"The friend who attends the bridegroom waits and listens for him, and is full of joy when he hears the bridegroom's voice. That joy is mine, and it is now complete." Jn 3:29

"If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." Jn 15:10-11

"Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete."

Jn 16:24

Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and <u>perfecter</u> of our faith, who for the <u>joy</u> set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and <u>sat down at the right</u> hand of the throne of God. Heb 12:2

#### **Praetorium**

Then they spit in his face and struck him with their fists. Others slapped him and said, "Prophesy to us, Christ. Who hit you?" Mt 26:67-68

Jesus' prophecy makes their question rhetorical:

"You are of your father the devil, and the desires of your father you want to do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him ...He who is of God hears God's words; therefore you do not hear, because you are not of God."

Jn 8:44-47

Everyone naturally reflects the image of their father. Our lives simply give evidence to which father we belong Thus: the devil's son hit Jesus - because he hit him

#### **Guilt: The Declaration of Innocence**



"[Pilate] took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. I am innocent of this man's blood," he said. "It is your responsibility!" Mt 27:24

Innocence by self-declaration?

Before God's Son?

Then the LORD said to Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" "I don't know," he replied. "Am I my brother's keeper?" Gen 4:9

The LORD said, "What have you done? Listen! Your brother's blood cries out to me from the ground. Now you are under a curse..." Gen 4:10-11

Guilty of the spilled blood

#### **Innocence: The Declaration of Guilt**



"These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from? ... These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore, they are before the throne of God and serve

him day and night in his temple."

Rev 7:13-15

#### Contradiction of natural world:

- Pilate's hands made bloody by washing in water
- Saints robes made white by washing in blood


Present day temple is our body; so service to God must be held there



#### **True and False Witnesses at Trial**

The next day... the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. "Sir," they said, "we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, 'After three days I will rise again.' So give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the third day. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first." Mt 27:62-64

## **Thief on the Cross**

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus answered him, "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise." Lk 23:42-43

"I tell you the truth today"? Unlikely - Jesus says: "I tell you the truth..." 30 times - never with "today"

#### The Point

Thief's confession is amazing: recognizes Jesus as King, the coming Kingdom, resurrection and GRACE all in one sentence!

=> Jesus comments that the thief has indeed accessed paradise with his confession on that very day



#### **Zaccheus' Conversion**

Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount." Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house"




Lk 19:8-9



Zaccheus received salvation while the stolen money was still in his possession

Would we make the same decision? (example of our trial)



# Despair on the Cross?

About the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" -which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Mt 27:45 quoting Ps 22:1

#### **The Hidden Context**

"You who fear the LORD, praise him! ...For he has not despised or disdained the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help." Ps 22:23-24

Hyperbole: the Psalmist knows God does <u>not</u> overlook the cry of the afflicted

So why does Jesus shout out the opening line of the Psalm?



#### **Matthew 27**

- When they had crucified him
- they divided up his clothes by casting lots
- He's Preaching! Trying save those in morta And sitting down of evil men has kept watch mcircled me
- Those who hurled insults at him, shaking their heads... "He trusts in God. Let God rescue him now if he wants him, for he said, 'I am the Son of God!" " *v35-43*

#### Psalm 22

- they have pierced my hands and my feet
- They divi garments cast lots

 All who see me mock me; they hurl insults, shaking their heads: "He trusts in the LORD; let the LORD rescue him. Let him deliver him, since he delights in him." v7-8,16-18


#### **Psalm 22: The Fulfillment**

Mt 27:45 / Ps 22:1

When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit. Jn 19:30

"It is fulfilled." Lamsa

"Yes, what is written about me is reaching its fulfillment." Lk 22:37



# Jesus' Declaration: the Misquoted Psalm?

Jesus David

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. Then I said, 'Here I am--it is written about me in the scroll-- I have come to do your will, O God." " Heb 10:5-7

Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but my ears you have pierced; burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not require. Then I said, "Here I am, I have come - it is written about me in the scroll. I desire to do your will, O my God" Psa 40:6-8

"My Ears You Have Pierced"

Psa 40:6

"But if the servant declares, 'I love my master and my wife and children and do not want to go free,' then his master must take him before the judges. He shall take him to the door or the doorpost and pierce his ear with an awl. Then he will be his servant for life."

Ex 21:5-6



#### **Servant for Life: From Choice**

#### David

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but my ears you have pierced" Psa 40

#### Christ

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me" Heb 10





Christ declares his desire to give his life in service to God

# **Doorway to the Master's House**

[The master] shall take [the slave] to the door or the doorpost and pierce his ear with an awl. Ex 21:6

- The slave was nailed to the doorway of his chosen
   Master's house nothing else would suffice
- · Comparison of Psalm 40 and Hebrews 10 shows Christ performing this practice (substituting his whole body for the slave's ear)
- ⇒ Christ's body was nailed to the Doorway of his Chosen Master's House

The Doorway to the House of God is the Cross of Jesus Christ

#### Price of the Pierced Slave: 30 Pieces of Silver

"If a bull gores a man or a woman to death, the bull must be stoned to death, and its meat must not be eaten...

If the bull gores a male or female slave, the owner must pay thirty shekels of silver to the master of the slave, and the bull must be stoned."

Ex 21:28-32

Then one of the Twelve--the one called Judas Iscariot--went to the chief priests and asked, "What are you willing to give me if I hand him over to you?" So they counted out for him thirty silver coins. From then on Judas watched for an opportunity to hand him over.

Mt 26:14-16

"Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill." Mt 5:17

# Fulfilling the Law

- the [bull's] owner must pay thirty shekels of silver to the master of the slave
- 2 and the bull must die Ex 21
- 1 When Judas... saw that Jesus was condemned, he... returned the thirty silver coins to the chief priests and the elders. Mt 27:3



So Judas threw the money into the temple and left. Mt 27:5



The money went back to God - the law was fulfilled

**2** Then he went away and hanged himself. Mt 27:5

#### **Death Sentence for the Bull's Owner**

If, however, the bull has had the habit of goring and the owner has been warned but has not kept it penned up and it kills a man or woman, the bull must be stoned and the owner also must be put to death. However, if payment is demanded of him, he may redeem his life by paying whatever is demanded.

Ex 21:29-30

"I am sending you prophets and wise men and teachers. Some of them you will kill and crucify; others you will flog in your synagogues and pursue from town to town. And so upon you will come all the righteous blood that has been shed on earth, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah son of Berekiah, whom you murdered between the temple and the altar." Mt 23:33-35

#### The Atonement of Jesus Christ


Atonement isn't about 'paying a penalty' for sin - else Christ would not have needed to do anything; it's about becoming one with God - which means 'Killing the Killer'

So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me... What a wretched man I am! Rom 7:21,24



Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, <u>once made perfect</u>, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him Heb 5:8-9

## An Eclipse and an Earthquake



What was this miracle for?

Emphasized how even Christ's death brought life How much more then his presence? Isa 65:17-25

# An Eclipse and an Earthquake

When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!" Mt 27:54

Centurion convinced by earthquake & eclipse > he was teetering on the brink of belief

#### Lessons for us:

- · Keep conversation spiritual for other teeterers'
- · God's Creation is a witness for Him Jer 8:7
- · We are God's Creation do we witness Him clearly?
- · Salvation came to centurion through Jesus' death
- · Atonement is about salvation; not sacrifice


## Why was the earthquake pivotal?

"Will not the land tremble for this, and all who live in it mourn?"



- Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me more than these?" [agape]
  "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." [phileo]
  Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." [lambs]
- Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you truly love me?" [agape]
- He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." [phileo] Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." [ewes]
- The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"[phileo]
- Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." [phileo]
- Jesus said, "Feed my sheep." [rams] Jn 21:15-18

# The Plagued House: The Israelite's House

• Inspected by Priest Lev 14:36

• If plagued: House v 39-42 scoured; unclean bricks disposed of

Period of waiting v 43

Second inspection v 44

"It must be torn down—its stones, timbers and all the plaster—and taken out of the town to an unclean place." v 45

"To purify the house he is to take two birds and some cedar wood, scarlet yarn and hyssop... In this way he will make atonement for the house, and it will be clean." vv 49,53

 If plagued, house is utterly destroyed

 If clean, house is atoned for



# The Plagued House: Physical Temple of God

- · Inspected by Priest
- · If plagued: House scoured; unclean bricks disposed of

Jesus entered the temple area and drove out all who were buying and selling there... "you are making it a 'den of robbers."

Mt 21:12-13

Jesus left the temple... "Do you see all these things?" he asked. "I tell you the truth, not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down." Mt 24:1-3

"it was so thoroughly laid even with the ground by those that dug it up to the foundation, that there was left nothing to make those that came thither believe it had ever been inhabited." Josephus, 'Wars of the Jews,' AD75; 7, 1, 1

our old self was crucified... that the body of sin might be done away Rom 6:6



He has set a day when he will judge the world Acts 17:31

"He who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces, but he on whom it falls will be crushed." Mt 21:44

God presented [Jesus] as a <u>sacrifice of</u> <u>atonement, through faith in his blood</u>, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. Rom 3:25

# How Are We Atoned (Made One with God)?

Why Did Jesus Die?

Killed by Sin (Sin Kills) Gen 3:15

To reveal our nature Ps 22 / Mt 27

To destroy the devil Heb 2:14

To open the Book of Life Rev 5:2-5

Because he loves us Jn 10:11-15

How does Jesus' death save us?

It doesn't: we are saved by his resurrection 1 Cor 15:17

How does Jesus' resurrection save us? He is alive to:

Show God's character: Mercy; Punishing guilty Ex 34:6-7
Succour and counsel us; come to us Jn 14:18
Exercise his authority to forgive our sins Mk 2:10
Be the Judge appointed by God Acts 17:31

We are atoned by forgiveness... ... because we are loved

# Theory 1: 168 BC - Antiochus Epiphanes

A Seleucid ruler whenter Jerusalem with little bloodshed, thus earning to nickname "Epiphanes." His armed forces rose to desecrate the temple, abolished the daily critices and erected pagan idols in order to she favor Hellenism.

Req 1: Must be future to AD 30

## Theory 2: AD70 - General Titus' Monument

Now as soon as the army had no more people to slay or to plunder, because there remained none to be the objects of their fury, (for they would not have spared any, had there remained any other work to be done,)

Caesar gave orders that they should now demolish the entire city and temple... it was so thoroughly laid even with the ground by those that dug it up to the foundation, that there was left nothing to make those that came thither believe it had ever been inhabited. This was the end which Jerusalem came to by the madness of those that were for innovations; a city otherwise of great magnificence, and of mighty fame among all mankind. Where is this city that was believed to have God himself inhabiting therein? ... I cannot but wish that we had all died before we had seen that holy city demolished by the hands of our enemies, or the foundations of our holy temple dug up after so profane a manner.


# The Holy Place, the Presence of God


The Holy Place is where God is, not (just) the Temple

Then the glory of the LORD departed from over the threshold of the temple and stopped above the cherubim. While I watched, the cherubim spread their wings and rose from the ground, and as they went, the wheels went with them. 

Accordingly, this place, on the north quarter of the city, and joining thereto, was a plain, and very properly named Scopus, [the prospect,] and was no more than seven furlongs distant from it. And here it was that Titus ordered a camp to be fortified for two legions that were to be together; but ordered another camp to be fortified, at three furlongs

farther distance behind them, for the fifth legion; for he thought that, by marching in the night, they might be tired, and might deserve to be covered from the enemy, and with less fear might fortify themselves; and as these were now beginning to build, the tenth legion, who came through Jericho, was already come to the place, where a certain party of armed men had formerly lain, to guard that pass into the city, and had been taken before by Vespasian. These legions had orders to encamp at the distance of six furlongs from Jerusalem, at the mount called the Mount of Olives which lies over against the city on the east side, and is parted from it by a deep valley, interposed between them, which is named Cedron. Josephus, AD 75, 'Wars of the Jews,' V, II, III

Thus did [the Jews] encourage one another when they were gotten together, and took their armor immediately, and ran out upon the tenth legion, and fell upon the Romans with great eagerness, and with a prodigious shout, as they were fortifying their camp. These Romans were caught in different parties, and this in order to perform their several works, and on that account had in great measure laid aside their arms...

Nay, things looked as though the entire legion would have been in danger, unless Titus had been informed of the case they were in, and had sent them succors immediately. So he reproached them for their cowardice, and brought those back that were running away, and fell himself upon the Jews on their flank, with those select troops that were with him, and slew a considerable number, and wounded more of them, and put them all to flight, and made them run away hastily down the valley. Josephus, AD 75, 'Wars of the Jews,' V, II, IV
