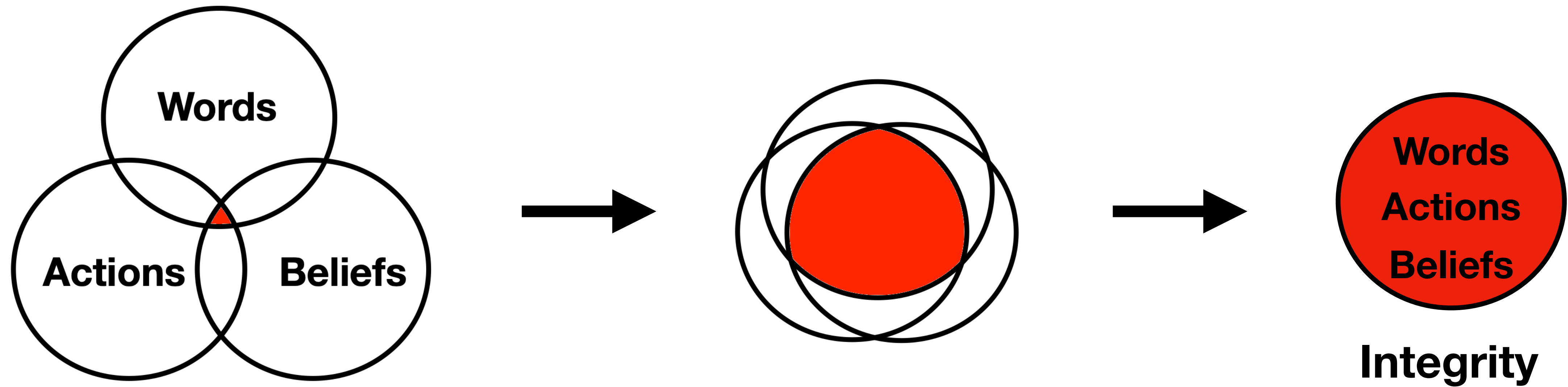

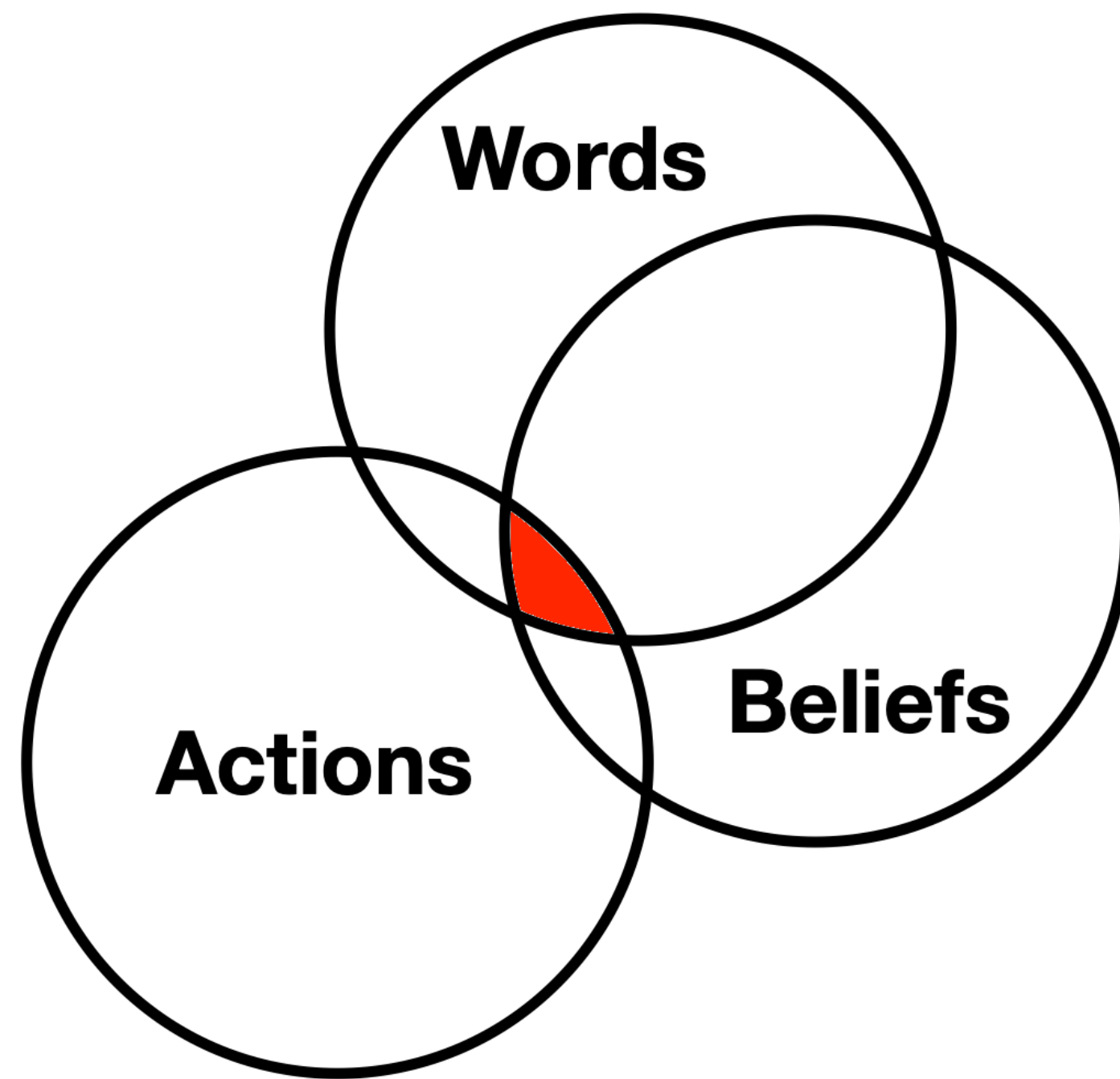

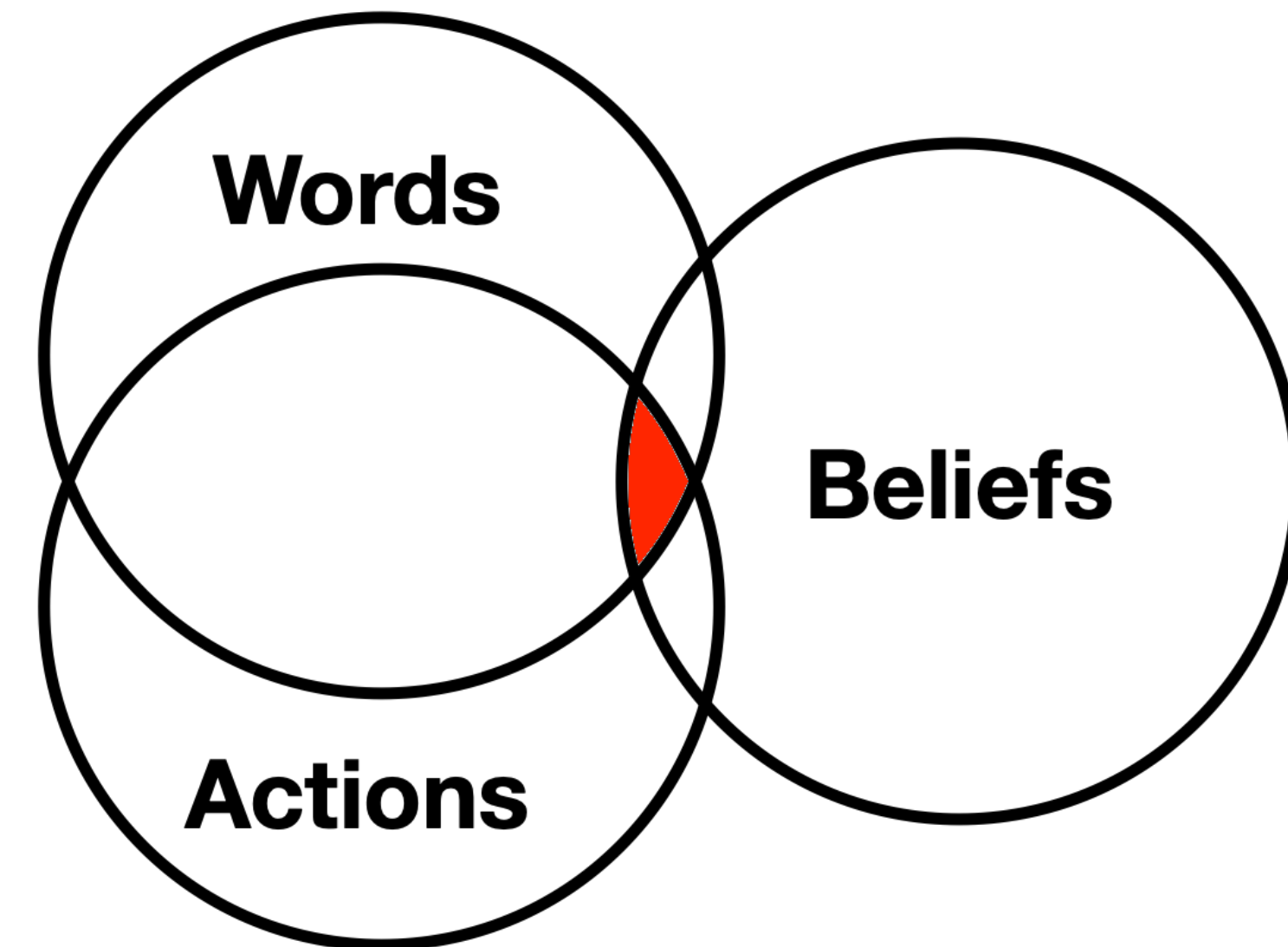

The Tylenol Tampering Incident—

When seven persons from suburban Chicago died after taking Extra Strength Tylenol capsules that had been maliciously adulterated with cyanide, the random and wanton nature of the killings caused extensive publicity. Although general information about the forensic work that accompanied the intensive investigation was released to the media, detailed accounts of certain aspects of the analyses were withheld. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has dealt with nationwide poisoning crises before (with mushrooms and salmon, for example). This time, however, the problem was not a processing or manufacturing mistake but murder. This ANALYTICAL APPROACH article describes the series of events that led to the involvement of FDA's Elemental Analysis Research Center (EARC) in the world of homicide investigation.

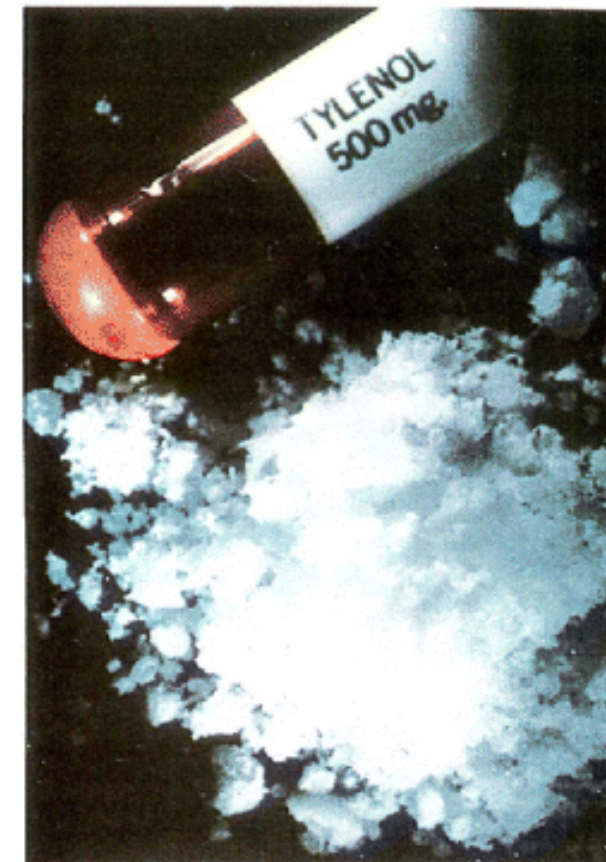
In the hours immediately following the initial discovery that capsules tainted with lethal amounts of potassium cyanide were responsible for three deaths in the Chicago area, federal, state, and local authorities were faced with a crisis of unknown magnitude. McNeil Consumer Products Company, a subsidiary of Johnson & Johnson and manufacturer of Extra Strength Tylenol, quickly recalled Tylenol capsules marketed in the Chicago area. Within a matter of days, FDA field offices had collected and inspected more than one million Tylenol capsules from across the nation (1). An additional bottle of adulterated

Tylenol containing 14 capsules packed with lethal amounts of cyanide was recovered from a suburban Chicago drugstore by FDA investigators. No additional cyanide-laced capsules were found outside the Chicago area. A massive campaign was launched urging Chicagoans to avoid taking Tylenol capsules. Consumers were asked to return recently purchased bottles to local stores or police departments, and subsequently two more bottles containing poisoned capsules were retrieved. Fast action by the authorities undoubtedly averted additional fatalities.

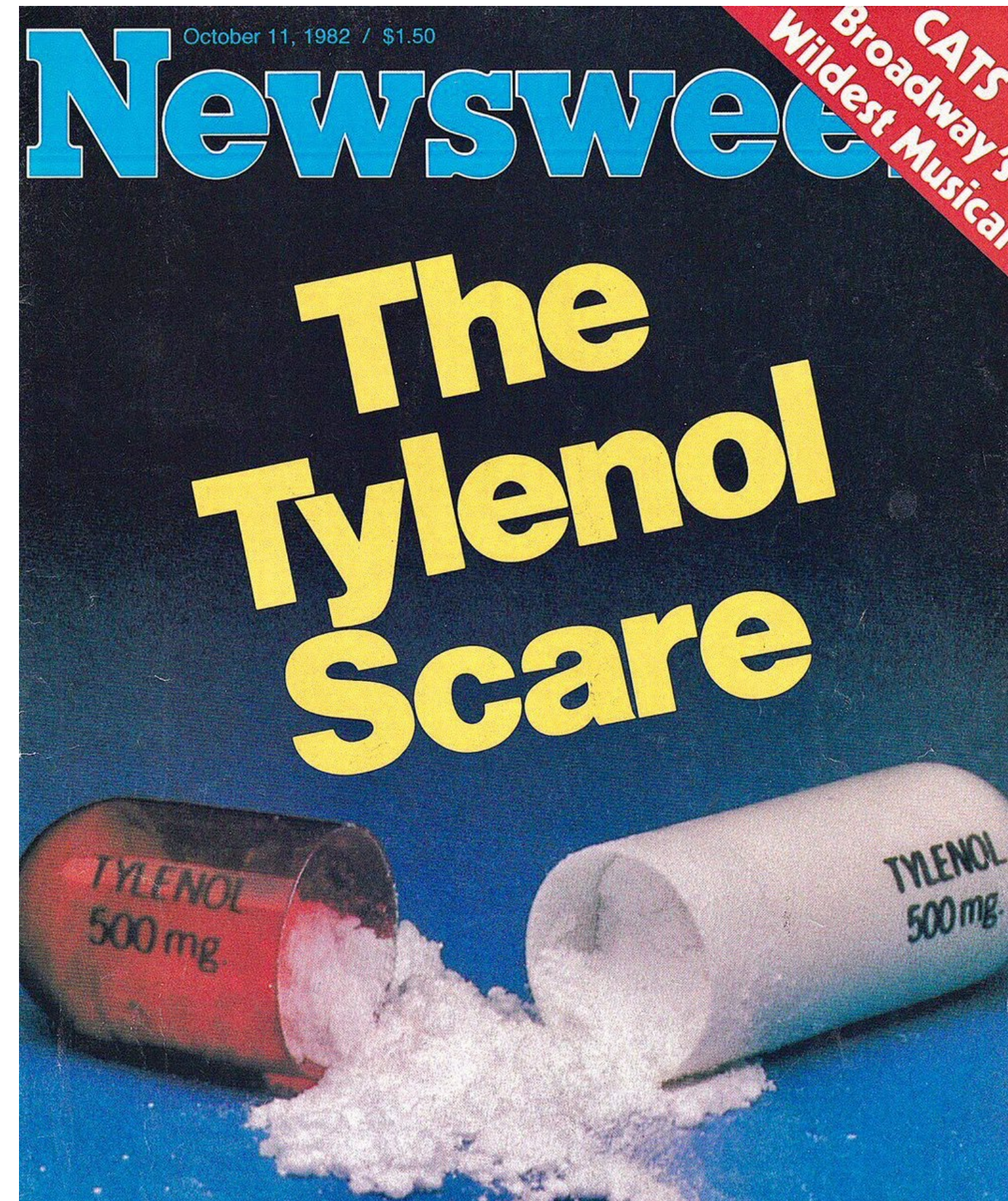
Initially, the possibility that tampering could have occurred during the manufacturing or shipping process was a major concern of the FDA. Although it is not used in the production of Tylenol, KCN is used as a testing reagent in laboratories at the manufacturing plants, and a quantity of KCN also was found in a Chicago warehouse where the implicated capsules had been stored. The fact that the tainted capsules were manufactured at two different locations—in Pennsylvania and Texas—lent support to the theory that the tampering probably occurred after the product reached the retail level; however, corroborating evidence was sought.

Forensic scientists have often used the total elemental composition of a material, such as paint or glass, to act as a "fingerprint" for a particular batch of that material. The identity and relative amounts of various ele-

mental constituents in a suspect sample form a distinct pattern that can be used for comparison with other samples, much like actual fingerprints. In this instance, the identifying pattern was developed by determination of trace element contaminants in KCN (which turned out to be a relatively

5 dead after taking Tylenol capsules filled with cyanide

Five suburban residents are dead after swallowing capsules of Extra Strength Tylenol that were filled with cyanide.

The poisonings triggered a nation-wide search for more contaminated pills, and state police health officials ordered all Tylenol taken off store shelves until further notice. Consumers were warned to look for bottles bearing the control number MC 288. The number found on bottles used were blamed for three of the deaths, and to avoid any Tylenol products regardless of the lot number.

The victims include 12-year-old Mary Kallman of Oak Grove Village, 22-year-old Adam Janus of Arlington Heights and his 20-year-old brother Stanley, a Lake incident who allegedly swallowed the pills in an attempt to calm his nerves after his brother's sudden death. Stanley's 19-year-old wife Theresa also took some of the poisoned Tylenol, and doctors at Northwestern Community Hospital in Arlington Heights said late Friday she is in critical and unstable condition and shows no signs of brain activity.

In DuPage County, the coroner's office said 27-year-old Mary Hoover of Woodfield died after taking poisoned Tylenol on Thursday. And a spokesman for Good Samaritan Hospital in Downers Grove said another poisoning also is suspected in the death of 30-year-old Mary MacFarland of Elmhurst.

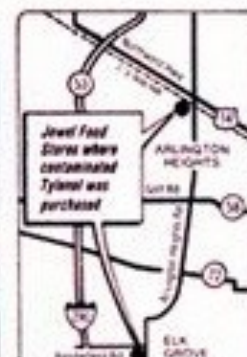
Local police said the contaminated capsules that killed Mary Kallman and the Janus brothers were purchased from two different Jewel supermarkets in Arlington Heights and Oak Grove Village.

Officials believe Hoover purchased her Tylenol at Frank's Food Fresh in Woodfield as an independent grocer.

AN ESTIMATED 10,000 capsules from the same batch were shipped to the Midwest in late August and were found in a total of 33 stores and 54 other communities throughout North-

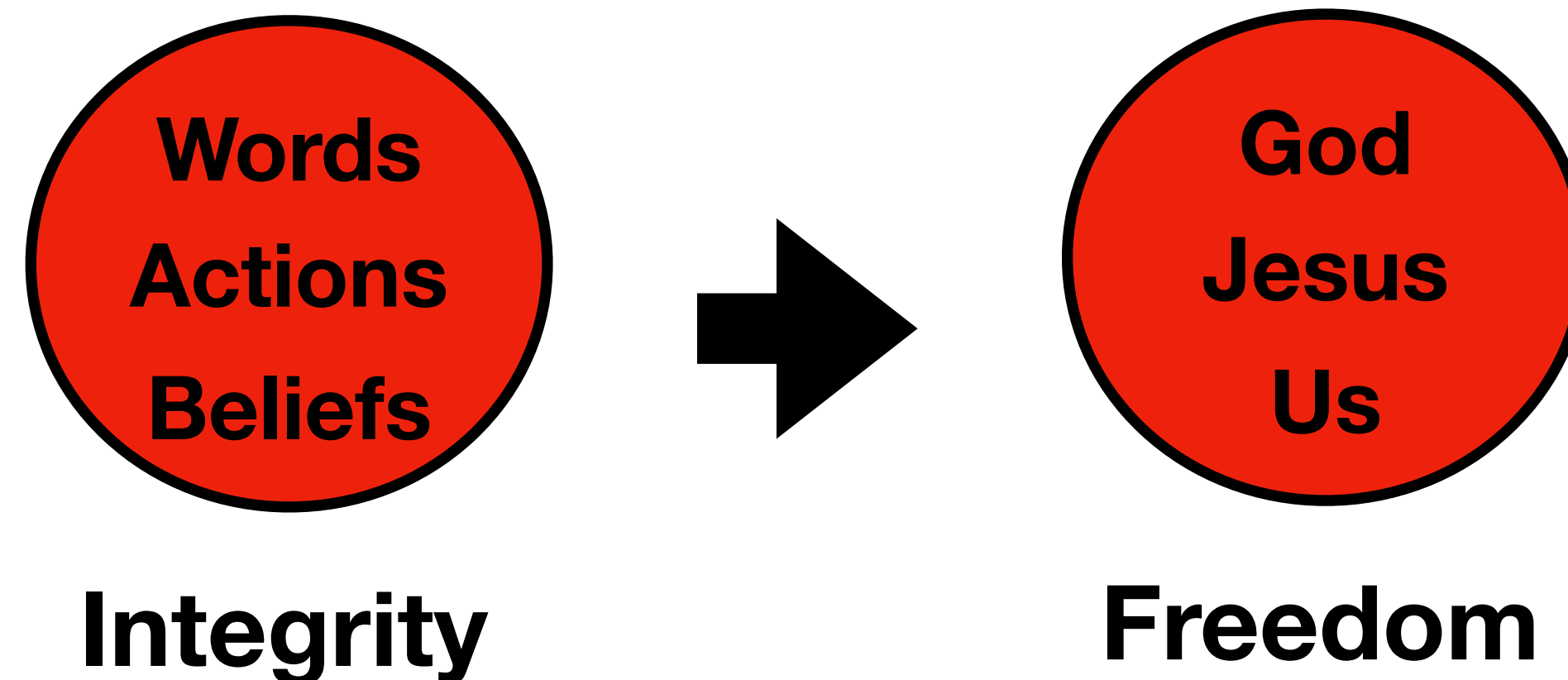
