
## Zechariah Part 3 - Vision 3 -The Man with the Measuring Line

• Consider for yourselves what might be the immediate, partial fulfillment of these visions and what aspects of the greater eternal fulfillment might be captured by these visions?

Vision	Content (Types and Echoes?)	Outcome
Vision 1: The Lord's Horsemen (1:7-17)	-A man (type of Christ?) leading horsemen "patrol the earth" to determine its condition	-God is jealous for Jerusalem -His house will be built there -God's cities will be prosperous
Vision 2: The Horns and Craftsmen (1:18-21)	-The 4 Craftsmen (the Saints) destroy the Horns that scattered Judah	-Destruction of the nations that have oppressed Judah
Vision 3: A Man with a Measuring Line (2:1-13)	-Jerusalem is measured by a man (type of Christ?)	-Jerusalem to be inhabited -God will dwell with his people
Vision 4: The Reclothing of Joshua (3:1-10)	-Joshua's dirty clothes removed, represents the cleansing of the peoples' sin	-Joshua (a type of Christ) will rule in God's house
Vision 5: Olive Trees and the Lampstand (4:1-14)	-A magnificent lamp-stand and olive trees represent God's watchfulness and power	-Zerubbabel (a type of Christ) will succeed in rebuilding the Temple by the power of God
Vision 6: The Flying Scroll (5:1-4)	-A flying scroll represents God's covenant with His people	-Curses will come on those who break the covenant
Vision 7: The Woman in the Basket (5:5-11)	-A Woman (representing Wickedness) is carried away to Babylon	-SIn and Death destroyed?
Vision 8: The 4 Chariots of the Lord (6:9-15)	-4 chariots pulled by 4 horses sent North and South (similarity to Horsemen in Vision 1)	-The final Victory; God's peace in the land
