Just give me Jesus – not self Too many people today tragically follow a fairy tale god. The God of Scripture is not our life coach. He is our Lord. We're used to this word as Christians, and so it loses its edge. This divine title signifies that God is ultimately our master. He is our sovereign. He is our ruler. He sets the tone for right and wrong. **He calls us to account for our sin....**

Wrong teaching on this point is why so many of us believe that Christian discipleship is synonymous with selfimprovement. "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him". John 12:25-26

True Christian discipleship is a call to die to self, not to improve our "self."

A Growing Danger

Moralistic therapeutic deism includes the belief that the primary goal of life is personal happiness and a positive self-image. God is viewed as rather distant from our day-to-day lives but available to solve problems and help us feel good about ourselves.

But that god is **not** the God of the Bible, nor does this pattern of teaching even come close to the walk of faith and salvation as set out for us in the Bible.

Jesus was speaking about here is <u>personal strength</u> <u>or power</u>. But Christ's power is the nutrient the branches receive. All the power lies in the vine itself. The centrality of Christ for living the Christian life has gotten buried in recent years by a way of thinking about Christianity called "moralistic therapeutic deism." It's a cumbersome term, but it's important to grasp, because it's everywhere, even within churches. According to Jesus, we are branches:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine dresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit." (John 15:1–2)

Moralistic therapeutic deism

Moralistic Therapeutic Deism....

- Moralistic Therapeutic Deism presents a unique understanding of God. This amorphous faith "is about belief in a particular kind of God: one who exists, created the world, and defines our general moral order, but not one who is particularly personally involved in one's affairs--especially affairs in which one would prefer not to have God involved. Most of the time, the God of this faith keeps a safe distance."

The new dominant religion....

• **Moralistic Therapeutic Deism** is also "about providing therapeutic benefits to its adherents." As the researchers explained, "This is not a religion of repentance from sin, of keeping the Sabbath, of living as a servant of sovereign divinity, of steadfastly saying one's prayers, of faithfully observing high holy days, of building character through suffering, of basking in God's love and grace, of spending oneself in gratitude and love for the cause of social justice, et cetera. Rather, what appears to be the actual dominant religion among North Americans is centrally about feeling good, happy, secure, at peace. It is about attaining subjective wellbeing, being able to resolve problems, and getting along amiably with other people."

Sin: out of step with the times....

- This radical transformation of Christian theology and Christian belief replaces the sovereignty of God with the sovereignty of the self. In this therapeutic age, human problems are reduced to pathologies in need of a treatment plan. Sin is simply excluded from the picture, and doctrines as central as the wrath and justice of God are discarded as out of step with the times and unhelpful to the project of self-actualization.
- Never forget: You were dead in your sins. You could not help yourself. But then God, who is rich in mercy, made you alive in Christ because of his great love for us....Eph. 2:1-13

When it comes to self-improvement and self-help goals and methods, whether we hope to be more physically fit, more socially engaged, more financially successful, more intellectually accomplished, or even more spiritually disciplined, we must take great care.

These goals, while they may seem harmless and even good, can swiftly become **idols**. Instead of pointing us to the only one who will most satisfy us, they can tempt us to focus on ourselves, on our own successes and failures. Then we begin to place our hope and identity in these endeavors.

Self lovers....

- The problem is obvious when we look at what society advocates in comparison to God's design for our lives. The world promotes self-help, self-improvement, self-reliance. Our culture says, "Get glory by achieving your dreams!" It encourages us to focus on ourselves and our desires in order to find fulfillment—and no wonder, for we are naturally self-lovers.
- "But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be **lovers of self,** lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. 2 Timothy 3:1-5
- But God's Word calls His children to self-control, self-denial, and Godreliance. We are to fix our eyes not on ourselves but on our gracious, give me Jesus glorious Savior, who deserves all honor and praise.

You can't put Jesus on a shelf....

• The problem with the world's way of thinking is that it is opposed to the essence of following Jesus - which is self-denial, not self**improvement.** Ultimately, through self-improvement you are trying to come to a place where you are proud and comfortable with who you are. But the more you look to yourself for your worth and happiness, the unhappier you will become. When we move toward self-improvement, we are relying less on Jesus, and more on ourselves. If we do not place Jesus on the throne of our lives we are cheating Him by not giving Him enough of ourselves. We cannot just put Jesus on a shelf for when we need him - for there are many other things that you can put over and under that shelf, but nothing can ever measure up to Jesus and what He adds to our lives and our journey of faith and salvation.

Who sits on your throne?

- "God can't give us peace and happiness apart from Himself because there is no such thing". C.S. Lewis
- God deserves nothing less than the throne in our lives, and until we can relinquish our chair we cannot truly follow him.

All right, have it your way....

- In his book The Great Divorce, C.S. Lewis says: There are two kinds of people: those who say "My will be done," And those who say to God, 'Your will be done'
- And to those who say to God 'My will be done.'" God simply says "All right, then, have it your own way...."
- When God is not first in our lives, when we refuse to deny ourselves for the sake of Jesus His son, God basically lets us have our own way, which is the worst thing that could happen to us.
- "There is a way that seems right to a man, but the end is the way of death." Prov. 14:12
- "See, this alone I found, that God made man upright (in the beginning), but they have sought out many schemes." Ecc. 7:29

RESTING FROM THE NEED TO ACHIEVE

 The world thinks this kind of sacrifice is absurd: "How can followers of Jesus possibly be content if they are always denying themselves, always pouring themselves out?" This is an excellent question. Even many professing Christians struggle in their faith; we feel as though we are always giving, always sacrificing—and we don't feel rewarded. The problem is that we are still looking at ourselves; we are still focused on our work, our service, our accomplishments—even when it is for God. But that's not how God wants us to live the new life He's given us. Jesus says, "Come to me all you who are weary, and I will give you rest"

(see Matthew 11:28-30).

My response:

- "His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire." 2 Peter 1:3-4
- If you put these things before the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, being trained in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine that you have followed. Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance. For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe. 1 Timothy 4:6-10

Out of the heart....

- And Jesus said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. For from within, **out of the heart of man**, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

The fix is in....

Knowing Him....
