The People Jesus called were...



"Follow me," he said to him. And he got up and followed him. As Jesus was having a meal in Matthew's home, many tax collectors and sinners were eating with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him.

When the experts in the law and the Pharisees saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, they said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?" When Jesus heard this he said to them, "Those who are healthy don't need a physician, but those who are sick do. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

"Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a **Pharisee** and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.







Takeaways

- · God's desire is to elevate the Lowly, your human measurables are not relevant to God.
- Sin is common to all, through Jesus, God is looking to complete a work in you, to enhance your unique capabilities, slowly work off your rough edges, and provide healing and wellness
- Doubt is not to be feared but expected, God will put us to the test. Only by giving up on God and rejecting the call of Jesus do we truly fail him. Doubt, questions, or a lack of courage are learning opportunities which Jesus will use to work with us, not hold against us.
