


Powerful Paraphrase's "Forgiveness cannot be obtained through religious ceremony"


"Christ's offering was exactly what was required"

Forgiveness

Vs

1	Law is a shadow (Heb 8:5 cp Mat 4:16)	It's an image of something greater. It is associated with death.
1	Law does not perfect a person (Heb 10:16 cp Deu 27:5-8)	This word perfect is used nearly 50% of the time in Hebrews. It represents 'complete', or 'finish'. It is tightly coupled together with what God will accomplish when he completes his word.
1,2, 3,11	Offering over and over (Psa 103:10-12)	Forgiveness is without value if it doesn't last and if the root problem is not resolved. Under the Law there was a continual reminder of your past sins.
3,4, 5,6,8	The sacrifice of animals was not what God required (Psa 50:8-14; 51:1-19; Hos 6:6; Mar 12:28-34)	This introduces the preeminence of the meaning of principles, over literal application. Note however David addresses the false idea that sacrifices were not required at all

God has prepared an offering (Psa 40:6-8 cp Luk 24:25-27 cp 1Cor 1:29)

The solution is provided by God. It is not within our power. The principles of God's wisdom, judgement, and mercy are upheld.

A singular sacrifice is a critical part of God's solution. Immortality doesn't work unless the solution is final.

25	Fellowship is required (1Cor 3:16 cp Jas 4:1-4; 2Cor 6:14-18; Eph 2:11-22) – (Act 2:42-46 cp Mat 18:15-20)	Prescribed fellowship, not of our own choosing. There is an urgency as the day of judgment approaches. The structure of our worship of God is according to his wisdom.
26	Deliberate sin after enlightenment has no forgiveness offered (1Joh 5:16)	If we turn from God, we cannot be forgiven. It is as if we would sacrifice Christ again.
		God's judgement is terrifying, death will not

escape us from it.

We are without excuse. Willfully sin and forsaking

the assembly is as if you trample Christ.

There is no escape from his justice.
