Why it is Important

Amo 3:7 Surely the Lord GOD will do nothing, but **he revealeth** his secret unto his servants the prophets.



Eze 24:14 I the LORD have spoken it: **it shall come to pass**, and I will do it; **I will not go back**, neither will I spare, **neither will I repent**; according to thy ways, and according to thy doings, shall they judge thee, saith the Lord GOD.

Num 23:19 **God is not a man**, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?

# Prophecy

**How we understand it**

What will happen in the future

A **subset of knowledge** that we **cannot fully understand** or **practically apply** but can influence our choices today.

**How we should understand it**

A **central characteristic** of God

**The foundation** of our faith and **the structure** on which we base our character and actions.

# Is Prophecy Truly Foundational?

## **Prophecy is not as important**

- Overemphasis on Prophecy Can Cause Division and Neglect Core Gospel Priorities
- Jesus Emphasized Ethics Over Predictive Signs
- Primary Biblical Purpose of Prophecy Is Moral Calling, Not Future Prediction

## **Is that a true statement?**

- What is the true cause of division? What are the core gospel priorities?
- What is the gospel?
- What is the basis for our moral response?



# Is Prophecy the Cause of Division?

Jas 4:1 What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you?  
Is it not this, that **your passions** are at war within you?

Jas 4:6 But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, “God opposes **the proud** but gives grace to the humble.”

# What are the Core Gospel Priorities?

## **Love God**

Requires knowing him and his commandments

Matt 22:37-40; John 14:21

## **Love your Neighbour**

Requires preaching God's word and applying it to our interactions

1 John 5:2-3; Rom 13:8-10



# The Gospel

Act 8:12 But when they believed Philip preaching the things concerning the **kingdom of God**, and the **name of Jesus Christ**, they were baptized, both men and women.

Act 28:31 Preaching the **kingdom of God**, and teaching those things which concern the **Lord Jesus Christ**, with all confidence, no man forbidding him.

# Prophecy – God Has Spoken

## Prophecy

Gen 1:3 And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.

Isa 53:7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth.

## Fulfillment

Immediate

Fulfilled – The Name of Jesus Christ

# Prophecy – God Has Spoken

## Prophecy

Isa 2:4 He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore.

## Fulfillment

Future – Kingdom of God



# The Gospel is Prophecy

Gal 3:8 And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel **beforehand** to Abraham, saying, “In you shall all the nations be blessed.”

Rom 4:3 For what does the Scripture say? “Abraham **believed** God, and it was counted to him as righteousness.”

# Prophecy Fulfilled

A manifestation of the character of God

Joh 1:14 And **the Word was made flesh**, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.



# Faith is grounded in prophecy

Heb 11:1 Now **faith** is the assurance of things **hoped** for, the conviction of things **not seen**.

Heb 11:6 And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must **believe** that **he exists** and that **he rewards** those who seek him.

# Practical Outcome of Faith in Prophecy

Heb 11:13-16 These all died in faith, **not having received the things promised**, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having **acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth**. 14 For people who speak thus make it clear that **they are seeking a homeland**. 15 If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. 16 But as it is, **they desire a better country**, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.



# A Future Hope

Heb 11:39-40 And all these, though commended through their faith, **did not receive what was promised**, 40 since **God had provided something better** for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

# Practical Application

Num 30:2 If a man vow a vow unto the LORD, or swear an oath to bind his soul with a bond; **he shall not break his word**, he shall do according to all that proceedeth out of his mouth.
